Learning intentions: I am learning to work out the total amount spent. I am learning to work out change.


Success criteria:

Learning intentions: I am learning about desert plants. I can take part in a desert yoga adventure.


Success criteria: I can discuss what a cactus does to survive in the desert. I can copy the yoga poses correctly.

Maths: Calculating Change - Change is the money returned after paying for something with more money than it costs. For example, if someone buys a 10p sweet bar with a 20p coin, they will get 10p back.

Follow up task – You can practise using your counting back and take away skills to work out how much change the person will be given on the additional maths slides. Make sure you look at the coins that the person used to pay and then calculate how much money they would need back. You can tell someone your answers or note them down to avoid printing.






